

A garden for St. Thomas of Canterbury

St. John Vianney Parish Organizes to Build a Better Community

St. John Vianney parish in the eastern foothills of San Jose serves a large, very diverse population. Unfortunately, some of the surrounding neighborhoods suffer from the presence of violent gangs, who recruit youth and endanger the community.

PACT (People Acting in Community Together) is an inter-faith, grassroots organization that empowers everyday people to work together to solve social problems. St. John Vianney was one of the founding parishes of PACT in 1985 and membership has been of great benefit to its parishioners. For example, members of the parish and surrounding community worked with PACT to campaign for smaller schools and charter schools in the area, and helped prevent the closing of a local youth center.

With other expenses in the parish, St. John Vianney parish was unable to afford PACT dues this year. Fortunately, they received funds this year from the Catholic Foundation to continue their membership. One of their goals is to help local parents organize to combat gang violence.

According to Beth Gonzales, a leader of the St. John Vianney organizing committee for

PACT, "The best way to discourage gang activity is to stop our youth from joining gangs in the first place." Gonzales explained three prevention strategies: supporting families of children and youth who are at risk for joining gangs, providing excellent education in the local schools, and offering extra-curricular activities to keep children and youth off of the streets.

"PACT focuses on empowering parents to create a better quality of life in our community so that their families can be safe and lead healthy lives," said Gonzales. "Jesus encouraged us to go out into the world and to help others. In our work with PACT, we are living out our faith."

Parish Stewardship

Stewardship as a Way of Life

Although most often associated with the material elements of "time, talent, and treasure," stewardship in our local Catholic parishes has a more important spiritual focus.

"Stewardship is a way of life that governs our outlook toward all of God's creation," said Deacon Wilfred Agbayani, Pastoral Administrator for St. Francis of Assisi. "As we become better stewards of the gifts God has given us, we move into deeper discipleship."

Ann Resch, Chair of the Stewardship Committee of St. Maria Goretti Church, says they help parishioners understand stewardship as a response to their baptismal call. "As disciples of Christ, we strive to be intentional, active and generous in daily living."

Both parishes have grown in recent years and their stewardship programs have not been able to keep pace. Grants received this year from the Catholic Foundation will enable them to support what Resch called the "four pillars of stewardship": prayer, formation, hospitality, and service.

As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace. 1 Peter 4:10 Resch and Deacon Agbayani emphasized the importance of bringing their faith communities closer together through stewardship. Foundation funds will be used to host faith formation programs, spiritual retreats, and celebrations. They will also be able to advertise the activities and provide educational materials in multiple languages.

"We are learning the critical importance of making people feel welcome through our stewardship programs," said Resch. The spirit of welcome is reflected in the parish's theme for its Jubilee year, "One Lord, One Faith, One Community."

Deacon Agbayani concurred, saying, "Transformation through stewardship begins when people feel a part of a community that worships and shares its gifts together."

Stanford Community Develops Young Catholic Leaders

Young Catholics have an abundance of skills to offer the Church, but they often do not know how to apply them and frequently lose touch with the Church after they leave campus ministry programs. When the Catholic Community at Stanford University had an opportunity to join a national program for Catholic student leadership development, it applied for and received funds from the Catholic Foundation.

ESTEEM (Engaging Students to Enliven the Ecclesial Mission) began last year at Yale University. It teaches Catholic ecclesiology and theology, provides opportunities to serve in local parishes, and offers students Catholic professional mentors. Through ESTEEM, students learn not only that their service is needed but how best to utilize their gifts.
