



 - If your program happens after April 13, turn in your report with projected numbers
- November 30, 2018 Mid-Year Reports due
- April 5, 2019 Final Reports due for 2018 grants

- If you want to make a significant change to your project, please contact Marie for approval first
- Photos of your program/project
- Mid-Year and Final Reports

- Return any unused funds to the Foundation



Mid-Year Report

- Brief summary of how the project is going
- Provide specific details and numbers, if possible
- Examples:
 - On February 23 there will be a parent meeting and potluck, there will also be another in May. Currently, educational field trips are being planned.
 - To date we used \$100 of the rent grant. We helped 14 families (a total of 28 persons). An additional \$500 is pledged to help 5 more families (17 people) in the next few weeks.

To date, we have planned both the 10th and 11th grade retreats. We are in the process of booking venues, transportation, and gathering supplies for the student retreat experiences. The 10th grade retreats will happen in January of 2017, and the 11th grade retreats are set to happen in March and May of 2017. We have spent the following of the Foundation funds:

- o \$927- Deposit for both 10th grade retreats
- \$1,032.50 Deposit for March Kairos (11th grade retreat #1)
- \$1,246.25 Deposit for May Kairos (11th grade retreat #2)
- \$600- Bus reservation fee for 11th grade retreats
- \$846.58- Necklaces (supplies for 11th grade retreat)
- \$241.88- Notebooks (supplies for 11th grade retreat)
 - Total: \$4,894.21

How did you track these numbers?

Rental assistance along with assistance for utilities, food and transportation is usually provided to families in need from our SVdP Conference funds on an ongoing basis. We supplemented our Conference funds with the \$2000 received from this grant. The funds were restricted for rental/housing assistance only. Each family that was provided rental or housing assistance with grant funds from the period of July 1, 2016 through November 30, 2016 was recorded in a spreadsheet (see attached). We also recorded the size of the family to determine the number of people directly helped.

3. Describe the short-term and long-term benefits of your program.

The short term benefits were that 14 families avoided eviction and homelessness by receiving rental assistance using the grant funds. Our long term goal is to try to refer these families to affordable housing alternatives but these opportunities are limited because the demand is greater than the supply in the Bay Area.

2. Approximately how many people did your program reach:

Directly: 35 Indirectly: 245

How did you track these numbers?

We have a combined total of 26 faculty plus 11 non-academic staff. Two were unable to attend the retreat because of family commitments. Thirty-five attended the day retreat which then benefits our entire student body. Fourteen were able to spend the night.

3. Describe the short-term and long-term benefits of your program.

Retreat goals are two-fold: the personal spiritual growth of the faculty and staff as well as creation of a spiritually Catholic environment within our school. The retreat happened mid-week during our preplanning week prior to the start of school (August 10-11). It was a welcome break from the planning meetings and policy review, providing opportunities for Mass, reflection, fellowship and formation talks. Those who were able to stay overnight received additional retreat from the day-to-day, more quiet and reflection.


4. What, if anything, would you do differently?

Nothing – it was a beautiful retreat and a wonderful start to the school year. Faculty and staff had personal time for spiritual reflection as well as time for fellowship and catching up with peers after being away for summer. The day included talks and discussion followed by dinner and a bonfire. The next morning started with breakfast and a hike at Rancho San Antonio before the wrap up session. Photos are attached.
